

Jonathan Cape, London, 1962, fourth reprint, 443pp, red boards, dustwrapper with 5 author reviews to rear panel. A fine book with just a touch of foxing to the first few pp, in a foxed and browned dustwrapper. The four Cape promotional postcards with Tony Hart's depictions of Captain Yossarian, Colonel Cathcart, Doc Daneeka and Lieutenant Minderbender are loosely inserted, which, although slightly foxed, are uncommon as a set.









A ROOM IN CHELSEA SQUARE


Jonathan Cape, London, 1958, second impression, 207pp, red boards with white titles to spine, dustwrapper. A fine book in a near fine dustwrapper, the spine a little browned. Written anonymously due to its overtly gay content when homosexuality was still illegal in Britain, it tells the story of a wealthy gentleman who lures a young man to his London flat with the promise of a better lifestyle.



4. Great Central Railway

PER RAIL. TRANSPORTATION IS THE LIFE BLOOD OF COMMERCE (SIR SAM FAY'S COPY)

Great Central Railway, 1913, 238pp, aeg, illustrations (in the text & full page), fold out 'Bird's Eye View of Immingham', fold out 'Colliery and Industrial Map', fold out 'Map of the Great Central Railway and its Connections', blue silk bookmarker, blue leather covers with titles and 'Sir Sam Fay' in gilt blind. The contents are in very good condition, with some foxing to the end papers and the two maps. There are some archive tape repairs verso to the View of Immingham and the GCR map. The spine is faded.








Sam Fay was a career railwayman - he joined the London & South Western Railway as a clerk in 1872, he rose up through the ranks and in 1892 he was seconded to the Midland & South Western Railway as Secretary and General Manager, which he saved from bankruptcy, before returning to the LSWR in 1899 as Superintendent of the Line. In 1902 he was appointed General Manager of the Great Central Railway and in 1912 he was knighted by King George V during the Immingham Dock opening ceremony. He retired from the GCR at the end of 1922 on the grouping of the railways and died in 1953. This is Fay's copy of a remarkable & impressive piece of GCR publicity published just before the outbreak of World War I.



A remarkable catalogue of rolling stock built by four of Britain's leading manufacturers - one of the photographs has a builder's plate with the year 1925, hence my dating. I have never seen one before.

The first edition of Jackson's uncommon book on the building of London's suburbs. A second, revised edition was published by Wild Swan in 1991.

Bradbury, Agnew & Co, London, not dated, [1876], landscape quarto, 144pp, aeg, 28 plates (including frontispiece) on pale green cartridge paper (as called for), blue cloth bevelled edge covers with gilt titles and border in blind. The contents are in very good condition - there is some foxing to the early pages and a few of the pages are a little worn down the right hand side. The half title and last page are toned. The covers have a little wear. The whole book has been re-cased by my bookbinder, so is ready for its next 140 years! Overall, a very nice copy of a delightful and rare book - Sambourne was a cartoonist for Punch.



13th edition, xlvii pp prelims + 708pp + 49pp Supplement, folding plan of Bradford, folding Ward Map of Bradford, decorative cloth. The contents are in very good, tight condition with a few minor flaws. The front cover is a little scuffed and my bookbinder has replaced the spine in matching cloth. There is a short, closed tear to the folding plan. A delightful, early directory with lists of residents and traders together with local advertisements.



KITSONS OF LEEDS 1837 – 1937

The Locomotive Publishing Co. Ltd., London, 1938, 185pp, illustrations, plates, 4 fold out diagrams, blue cloth covers with gilt titles to spine, dustwrapper. The book is in fine condition, although the front end paper has been removed. The dustwrapper has a little loss to the corners & edges and has been strengthened with 'lick & stick' paper verso. Overall a handsome example of a scarce book - one in its original dustwrapper is exceptional.



After nearly a century of locomotive manufacturing, a slump in the heavy engineering industry in the early 1930s and the policy of the railway companies of building their own locomotives led to a fall in orders and Kitsons called in the receivers in 1934. In 1937, a new owner and an injection of working capital brought the receivership to an end but the reprieve was to be short lived - the company ceased locomotive production in 1938 and the remaining business was sold to J & H McLaren in 1945.

The dustwrapper has a little edge wear, the spine is a touch faded and there is some foxing to the back panel. An uncommon book tellng the story of the Orr family's journey by Land Rover from Brazil to Canada.





The contents are in excellent condition, with a little foxing here & there. There is a long birthday dedication to 'Ron Rudd, a fellow ferroequinoligist ...' The covers are a little speckled (insect?) and a touch edge worn. Overall a handsome copy of an uncommon, early Baldwin publication, much is given over to the history of the company. Burnham Williams & Co was the name of the company until 1909 when it changed its name to Baldwin Locomotive Works.



The book is in excellent condition, with a touch of fading to the very edges of the covers and a dedication at the front. The dustwrapper is somewhat tired and a touch faded, with a little loss at the top of the spine and some archival tape repairs verso. Included is some associated contemporary ephemera. A rare book, one in its original dustwrapper is exceptional.







The illustrator, Mahadev Vishwanath Dhurandhar, was a noted Indian painter and postcard artist.

The contents are in excellent, tight condition, with a little foxing here & there and a former owner's bookplate at the front. The boards are quite worn & scratched, the spine is darkened and there is a small sticker on the upper board. The book has been re-backed by my bookbinder retaining the original spine. Overall a very nice copy of Langdale's seminal reference work.



Covers very good with a little rubbing here and there, particularly the edges and spine ends. A lavish publication providing a sketch of the King's life, an account of his visit to Leeds and a history of Leeds from 1835 to 1911. Pages 67 to 103 are photographs and illustrations of the city and its buildings, and pages 110 to 139 provide a programme of events.

The book is in very good condition, with a birthday dedication to the rear of the fep. The cloth is lifting from the lower part of the front board. The dustwrapper has some browning and wear to the top edge. Overall a good copy of the first title in Ward's 'Starting to Read' series from a collection I acquired recently and will be bringing to the Fair.

OVERHAULING BUSES AT THE CHISWICK WORKS OF THE LONDON GENERAL OMNIBUS CO. LTD

General Omnibus Co. Ltd, printed at The Curwen Press, 1932, 20pp, descriptive text + captioned photographs, glazed card covers designed by Edward McKnight Kauffer. In very good condition, the covers a little edge worn and some printing information to the inside of the front cover, from which it would seem that 2000 copies were printed. Rare – the first I've seen.



A remarkable publicity item from the General Omnibus Co. Ltd with McKnight Kauffer's delightful cover design. Maurice Beck was a well-known photographer in the 1920s & 30s, who, along with Helen McGregor, was head photographer for Vogue. McKnight Kauffer is best known for the posters he designed for London Underground, later London Transport.

The findings from a fact finding mission to the USA by C W Bayley, Chief Traffic Manager, and Oliver Winder, Chief Works Manager, of the L&YR. From a small collection I will be bringing to the Fair.



PRIVATE PLEASURE VESSEL LICENCE PLATE

A hexagonal enamelled plate with fixing holes, 4.5" x 3.5", licence number 3378 for 1947. This plate would have been attached to a launch on the River Thames to evidence that it was a licensed craft and the required dues had been paid. In excellent condition, hard to find better!




Licence plates were white until 1931, then brown from 1932 to 1946, red in 1947 and blue in 1948, the last year before plastic plates were introduced.

SMITH'S DOCK MONTHLY BRITISH EMPIRE EXHIBITION NUMBER

No. 54, Volume V, April 1924, iv + [136]pp, photographs etc., in the text, thick paper covers. In very good condition, the covers a little grubby and worn. This issue mainly concerns itself with a history of the company to the then present day with its two sites in North Shields and Middlesbrough. The British Empire Exhibition opened in late April 1924 and Smith's had a large stand at the Exhibition. In October 1924 the company published a further British Empire Exhibition number, which included many photographs of the Exhibition.



Morton & Co., 1880, 32pp + [10]pp advertisements, engravings in the text and full page, paper covers. In very good condition, the covers a little marked and 2" loss of spine covering at the top. For some reason, a former owner has changed the page numbers in ms so they start at 41 and go 72.

THE FORTH BRIDGE (REPRINTED FROM "ENGINEERING" FEBRUARY 28, 1890)







Offices of Engineering, London, 1890, folio, 71pp, 156 figures in text, 19 plates (as called for), dark blue cloth covers with titles in gilt blind. Some foxing (principally to the title page), the front end paper missing and some marks to the covers, otherwise a lovely copy of an impressive work.

A marvellous feat of engineering, the Forth Bridge was the first in Britain to be built of steel. It took 7 years to build and opened in 1890.

36. Watney Combe Reid & Co., Limited (Watney's)

HAND IN HAND. A BROKEN RUN OF 56 ISSUES FROM VOLUME 1 NO. 2 TO VOLUME 12 NO. 2

Watney Combe Reid & Co., Limited, 56 issues from December 1919 to December 1930, illustrations, adverts etc., paper covers. In generally good condition, the covers a little marked, dusty and worn, one front cover missing and one rear cover crumpled.

A recent attic find, this is a run of the Watney in-house magazine from the inter-war years containing much social history of the company and its Stag Brewery in Pimlico, London. At its peak in the 1930s, Watneys was one of Britain's largest companies.

37. Llewelyn, Robert & Leslie, Gerry

Whittington Press, 2008, comprising a book in a zig-zag binding with text by Robert Llewelyn (the grandson of William Clough-Ellis who built the Italianate village of Portmeirion in North Wales in the 1920s) and images by Gerry Leslie, a set of signed prints of the images including an additional image and a poster of one of the images together with associated ephemera, all housed in a solander box, in as new condition.

Of the 350 copies published, Whittington originally intended that 290 copies would be regular copies and 60 would be special copies, of which this is one. However, although the total number of copies remained the same, the special edition was extended to 125 copies and this is number 61.

SIGNS BY BRILLIANT SIGNS

Brilliant Signs Ltd., London, 1939, 56pp, profusely illustrated, many in colour, card covers with red cord tie. In virtually new condition, a touch of foxing to the covers.

A remarkable catalogue of metal, glass, illuminated, neon etc., signs manufactured by Brilliant Signs, which was established in 1887 and moved to their Paragon Works in Shepherd's Bush, London in 1907.



40. British Army of the Rhine

Headquarters, British Army of the Rhine, Germany, December 1947, folio, xii + 142pp, 11 plates, 17 maps, aerial photograph and general map of the Rhine in pocket at rear, maroon cloth covers with titles in gilt blind. The textblock has parted in two places so the adjoining pages are loose and there are sellotape stains from old 'repairs'. The covers are a little marked. The maps etc., are as called for. Formerly the property of The Royal Scots Regimental Museum and with their stamps at the front.

After the war, the Headquarters of the British Army of the Rhine, compiled Battlefield Tours for seven operations in the North-West Europe Campaign between June 1944 and May

1945, of which Operation Plunder was one. Only 150 Directing Staff copies were printed for each Operation.
