The first of two novels by this Scottish author who for a long a time was more famous for her controversial biographies of Robert Burns and D.H. Lawrence. Despite winning the £250 prize for Melrose's novel of the year competition (advertised on the back of the title page), this and her second novel, "The Camomile" (1922), have only gained greater attention in more recent decades after being republished by Virago. Uncommon.

Founded by George Murray Smith of Smith, Elder & Co. as a rival to Dickens' "All The Year Round", William Makepeace Thackeray was appointed as its first editor. This set contains the first ten years of its existence, which also saw the high-water mark of its popularity, providing the first appearance in print for many literary works by some of the most notable writers of the day, including the first serialisations of Anthony Trollope's "Framley Parsonage" (1860), George Eliot's "Romola" (1862-63) and Elizabeth Gaskell's "Wives and Daughters" (1864-66). Although sales dwindled after 1870 the magazine still serialised important works by the likes of Joseph Conrad, Thomas Hardy and Henry James in its later years.
