

Fair condition overall. Significant toning to paper throughout, tears to pages. Lacks Map. Plate 25 from 1st German edition. Losses to plate and text for plates 25 and 26.

This celebrated work by Jacques Le Moyne, and illustrated by De Bry, is the most important early work on the early History of Florida. It describes the early French settlements in Florida and is beautifully illustrated with plates of the Timucua First Nation.

Overall an unadulterated original copy of this important work. Loose and partially bound. Would benefit from restoration and rebinding.



This work is a cornerstone for any travel library and a celebrated work of English literature in its own right. It contains detailed accounts of all early travel before 1600 including many never before published.

Good condition overall. Some foxing to text and marks to plates. Modern quarter leather binding with gold title to spine on red leather.

This part describes the Second Dutch expedition to the spice islands in 1598-99. The voyage was a huge success, bringing over one million pounds in weight of pepper and cloves and making a huge profit for the investors. The success directly led to the formation of the Dutch East India Company (VOC).

Of note, the island of Mauritius was named after Maurice of Nassau during the expedition.

The title-page is embellished by Dodos and the illustrations depict trade between the Dutch and local islanders. The island of Banda is shown and a very early illustration of Sepak Takraw (foot volleyball).

This hugely important work was published after Linschoten's extended stay in Portuguese Goa where he worked for the Viceroy. Here he learnt much about the inhabitants and culture in the East. He also described trade opportunities with China, Japan and the Spice Islands. This information was hugely important and allowed the Dutch to break the Portuguese monopoly in the East

Part 2 contains sections on Spain, Africa, and the famous Arctic voyages of Barentsz.



L'Isole più famose del mondo was one of the most popular atlases of the late sixteenth century, treating the world as a collection of islands. The atlas contians 2 world maps, a very early map of North America, a map of the spice islands as well as many maps of European Islands, Great Britain, Hispaniola and the Caribbean This third edition contains seventeen additional maps, mostly of the islands of the Greek archipelago, which were introduced in the 1576 edition.

This copy has a distinguished provenance from the Earl of Macclesfield's Library - sold in Sothebys in 2007

- This work describes Benzoni's 15 years on the isthmus of America, in Panama and Nicaragua.
 - Benzoni, an Italian, acted as a mediator between different nations. The work describes life of the first nations of Central America, Benzoni wrote at a time when the Spanish treatment of the Indians was a concern, and described the cruelty of the Spanish towards the Indians and African slaves - the famous "Black legend". The work is beautifully illustrated with engravings of the Native Americans and Spanish conquistadors. It including images of Nicaraguans dancing, how they held their markets, and made war, and of slaves being harshly treated. Engravings depict France's failed efforts to colonise the Southern Americas


Parkinson's journal is regarded as the finest account of Cook's first voyage. Employed as a draughtsman, he drew the celebrated images of Australia and New Zealand, which are well known to this day. Tragically he died on the return to England, but his brother arranged the publication of this work. The work contains valuable South-Sea vocabularies and the first published use of the word kangaroo.

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

Engraved by Arnold Florent van Langren (1580-1644) and published in Linschoten's Itinerario in 1596 -38 x 54cm (15 x 22 inches)

Beautiful colour (Likely 20th Century) -Re-margined professionally. There is some sign of toning to the paper which does not visually detract from the overall quality or appeal.

The map depicts the East coast of Africa, from modern day South Africa, to Mozambique, Madagascar, Tanzania, Kenya and Zanzibar. The chart is likely based on stolen Portuguese charts by Bartolomeu Lasso. The chart is beautifully engraved, and contains depictions of Lions and Elephants and the famous "Prester John", a fabled Christian King in Africa. Three ships in full sail are shown alongside a sea monster in the Indian Ocean and three wind roses are finely engraved.

Very Rare first French edition of this highly important description of the Gold Coast of West Africa. This account was first published in Dutch in 1602. It contains an account of Guinea illustrated with finely engraved plates. It includes a dictionary of French words and phrases converted from the local language. Topics include rituals and ceremonies, warfare, transportation, plant and animal life, dress, ornamentation, and dance.

It contains all the accounts from the first Latin edition of 1532 apart from Münster's Introduction, to which the map belongs. No map is therefore wanted in this edition. This edition also contains Peter Martyr's Decades and De Legatione Babylonica, both wanting in the Latin editions. Famous Voyage accounts include those by Varthema, Cadamosto, Vespucci and Columbus.

This edition is extensively illustrated and contains extra illustrations taken from Parkinson's description of the 1st voyage, alongside the original plates from the English edition.

Important plates in this volume include the earliest engravings of Maori and Australian First nations, and the earliest depiction of the Kangaroo. Important maps are of New Zealand and the East Coast of Australia. The binding has the mark of Sigmund von Haimhausen (1708-1793) the first president of the Bavarian Academy of Science
