

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165. James Cook's First Voyage to 'The South Sea' 1768-1771. The eight line Report on page two of the newspaper, above, announces the sailing of 'The Endeavour Bark' from Plymouth ... to the 'South Sea', with Astronomers etc on board to observe the transit of Venus over the Sun ... Several 'Gentlemen of Fortune' are gone out in her ... (i.e. Joseph Banks and his entourage). The voyage began on August 28th., so it was a fortnight before the news was announced here in this complete, 8 page, copy of the newspaper. c.28 x 21cm. Very good clean condition. The transit of Venus was observed both at Point Venus, as it became known, and elsewhere in Tahiti in case weather conditions at one site prevented observations. The chart of Point Venus was published by Alexander Hogg in London, c.1784-5. Joined is a similar chart of Owharre Harbour in Huahine, which was visited by Cook on each of his voyages, as was Matavia (Matavai) Bay. The charts measure c.14 x 10cm. (*Robson, John. 



These were found in a small collection of similar prints, all more or less damaged, these three only being 'rescuable'. All three signed 'S.T.G.' within the image on left, all published by James J. Blundell & Co., (no street name) Melbourne, two dated 1855. All three measure c.20 x 12.5cm., so have been trimmed slightly. All three laid down on art card.
 - 1) 'Market Square from Little Malop St. Geelong'. Slight tanning but generally good and clean. (Image above). 2) 'Arrival of Geelong Mails main road Balla(a)rat'. The surface of the print is covered with small 'bumps'. Light tanning to the edges. 3) 'Interior of John Alloo's Restaurant, Balla(a)rat'. Stain to top left of the image, light tanning and soiling. (Further images available on request). The collection of three prints.
- **249.Challenor, J(ohn).** A holograph letter, in ink, (image above) written from Broome, West Australia, via Singapore. 6th. Sept . '05. A bifolium the fourth page blank. c.20.5 x 12.5cm. as folded. In all 55 lines neatly written. The first 15 lines are concerned with family matters, the remainder with Challenor's attempts to earn a living from pearling out of Broome. He also goes 'with Streeter's Schooner 'Annie (Taylor?) to pick up luggers from the Lacepede Islands and take them to Java and the Aru Islands, Bali and Soembaya'. ... 'in the East Australia is suffering ... working men starve ...' 'An Australian lady spoke out to me the other day "Australia is the most drunken country on the face of the earth ... you don't know what drunkenness is until you've been to the other side".' (East coast). (A photographic image in the State Library of W.A., dated 1910, shows 'Pearling crew and Captain J. Challenor, Broome', so perhaps he made good).




