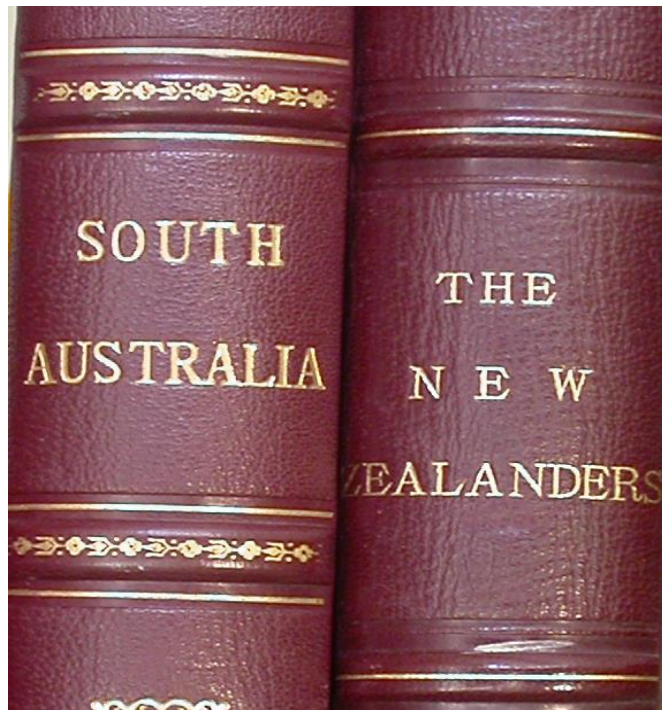

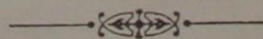

**3. American Troops in Papua in World War 2.** From Chronology 1941-1945. No compiler or editor. No place or date. Title + 79 pages. 29.5cm. Rectos only. 4 large folding colour maps. Soft covers. Title lettered in black to spine and upper cover. Good clean condition. This is an almost daily record in chronological sequence of the activities of the American (and Australian) military in New Guinea, Trobriand Islands, Bougainville, New Britain, and SWPA. This appears to be entirely produced by hand. There a number of tippex corrections with typescript on top of the tippex. The 'printed' title appears to be 'letraset', some of the letters are not quite in line. Similarly with the maps; a close examination suggests that they are hand drawn, though done with great care and skill. Each map has been drawn in two 'halves' each on a sheet of paper of the same kind and size as the text. Originally joined with 'sellotape', or similar, resulting in the usual unsightly stain, but on the verso. This tape has been removed and replaced with very thin, almost invisible, archive tape. 25883. **£100**
