### 'Letters from Australia in the British Press 1790 – 1850'



A selection of c.50 letters from free emigrants and convicts, and from Governor Phillip, relating their first-hand experiences, their first impressions of the 'new country', their successes and the challenges they experienced. In the first decades of the 19th. century, such letters often provided the first and only information available for those 'back at home'.

The earlier letters came from New South Wales, or Van Diemen's Land, in the later decades from Swan River, Port Phillip and South Australia.

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## Art in Australia. A Quarterly Magazine.

#### A selection of numbers from the Third Series.

These were acquired as a collection and they had evidently been in storage for many years. The condition overall is good but where a spine was defective, or lacking, a new spine has been added using bespoke 'spine repair tape' (see 'The Art of Lionel Lindsay' above). The paper on which the text is printed has foxing most restricted to the page edges. The plates are on different paper, including those tipped in, are not affected by foxing and are clean throughout. Some numbers have rust spots from the staples. All numbers have been checked for completeness. Any necessary comments re condition of specific numbers, are given where required.

All numbers are of similar dimensions, c.24.5 x 19cm., and are usually of c.64pp. (though not always numbered). The number of plates, whether bound in or tipped in, varies from number to number, and are indicated. All numbers contain illustrations in the text and advertisements, often also illustrated. The majority of numbers have 'yapp' edges to the covers and these are subject to wear or fraying. Some numbers have the small label of Angus & Robertson Ltd. 89 Castlereagh St. Sydney on the front end-papers.
