Lamilami presents a copy of his book 'Lamilami Speaks. The Cry Went Up. A Story of the People of Goulburn Islands, North Australia' (Ure Smith. Sydney. 1974) to Axel and Roslyn.

When Axel undertook his expedition to Arnhem Land in 1952, he was accompanied by three Aborigines from Goulburn Island, including Lamilami who was a 'man of authority' in the area. Lamilami devotes several pages in his book to the time he spent with Axel " ... he was a very kind-hearted man and he loved to help the people ... he used to go hunting with (the people) ... they weren't very happy about the cameras ... the first time Axel took a photo and the flashlight went off the people took off for the bush and didn't want to come back ... ". See item 2


The majority of the items in this catalogue were published post World War Two, and many since c.1990, so there are books by authors who have been concerned with, or who have contributed to, the so-called 'History Wars'. Having lived for some time in Tasmania, I have read much on the early history of the Island State, and am familiar with the various arguments, but here I shall add only comments from reviewers relating to the books catalogued, and shall avoid any personal comments.

Roslyn Poignant, whose books these were, was an anthropologist, author and curator, and was highly regarded and much loved by all who came into contact with her. She began buying books from me in the early 1980s and it has been a great privilege, and a pleasure, to work on her library.

1. **Kyle-Little, Syd**. Whispering Wind. Adventures in Arnhem Land. Hutchinson. London. 1957. 240pp. 21cm. 38 black and white photographic illustrations. End paper maps, both end papers with areas of tanning. Hard cover in black, with white lettering to the spine and red decoration to upper cover. The spine slightly cocked. Ink signature on blank preliminary. A good bright clean copy.

WITH: Four weekly numbers of 'John Bull' magazine for April 6th, 13th, 20th & 27th. 1957 in which Kyle-Little's book is serialised under the title 'Land of Singing Death'. At the end of the April 27th. 'extract' is stated that "Syd Kyle-Little's book will be published at 18s. by Hutchinson on May 27 (a month later), under the title 'The Whispering Wind'". The John Bull 'extracts' extend to 19 large pages, c.34 x 26cm and of 3 or 4 columns. There are 21 illustrations, some in colour, and most appear in the book, though here enlarged or cropped. At least one was taken by Axel Poignant, though no credit is given. The text of the extracts can sometimes be found in the book, though much of the extracts has been edited. It is not indicated whether this was done by the author. The four numbers are in good clean condition with slight tanning and edge wear. The book and the four numbers of 'John Bull'. 28167.



Syd Kyle-Little left his post of Patrol Officer in Arnhem Land, so vividly described in his book, in 1950. Just two years later Axel Poignant arrived in the same area and made his camp with the Aborigines. Axel was accompanied by Lamilami throughout his stay of 'about 9 weeks', and Lamilami describes this period in his book 'Lamilami Speaks', see image opposite, and item 2 below.

(Lamilami was of great assistance to Axel whilst he assembled his 2500 images in the Liverpool River area of Arnhem Land in 1952). 27529.

"And Reconciliation doesn't promise us human rights, it doesn't promise us our Sovereign rights, or the platform from which to negotiate, and it doesn't promise us a viable land base, an economic base, a political base, or a base in which we can again heal our people, where we can carry out our cultural practices." (Kevin Gilbert).
