The jacket with slight wear and soiling. Gifted in ink on half title: 'To Axel Poignant Artist among photographers. With all good wishes. Colin Roderick. 26th. November 1951'. Also signed by Axel Poignant on end paper. A good clean copy. 28405.
- **3.** Harrower, Elizabeth. The Watch Tower. Macmillan, London. 1966. (1st.ed). pp.(iv)+220. 20cm. Hard cover in dust jacket. Very slight edge wear and staining to the jacket which is not price clipped. A very good bright clean copy. 28339.
- **4. Bachmann, Ingeborg.** Days in White. Translated by Angelika Fremd. Transcription drawings by Ruark Lewis. Five Islands Press, Wollongong University, NSW. 2003. 96pp. 22.5cm. Portrait. Black and white line decorations many of which " ... render visually the sound qualities of Bachmann's poetry ... ". One, on the half title has a pencil note beneath it 'for Rossie lots of love Ruark', a second with note 'R04 another for Rossie unreadable version'. WITH a 4-page letter from Ruark to 'Dear Rossi ... ' with a variety of news and events in which he has been involved, at galleries and elsewhere, a book (of Roslyn's?) he has been reading, and art he has been doing, including " ... a few extra drawings for your very special copy of Bachmann's poems". This suggests that the two illustrations with pencil notes 'for Rossi' are original artwork. Signed by Roslyn Poignant on end paper. Soft covers. Staining to top edge of final few pages. Gifted 'To Ruth and Axel from Pat and John Thompson, Collaroy 1945 (?)'. Ruth was Axel's second wife; John Thompson was the poet





- **22. Rutherford, Meg.** The Beautiful Island. Doubleday & Company, New York. 1969 (1st.US ed). 70pp. (unnumbered) 18.5 x 23cm. (landscape). Line illustrations throughout with captions. Laminated hard covers with acetate jacket. 'Special Gift Edition'. Good clean copy. Signed by the author/artist on the half-title, with a post card from Meg gifting the book to "Dearest Ros A wee thing but ...?" 'signed' with the small flower which she used often. 28225. 'an adult fantasy'.
- (The author, artist and sculptor, Meg Rutherford was born on a sheep farming property in Bathurst, NSW in 1932 and after National Art School, Sydney, graduated from The Slade School of Fine Art, London. Meg, and her husband Amis, were close friends of Axel and Roslyn. A few of her immense output of books are listed here although these do not have Australian content).
- **23. Rutherford, Meg.** The Beautiful Island. Allen and Unwin, London. 1969 (1st.UK ed). 64pp. (unnumbered) 18.5 x 24.5cm. (landscape). Line illustrations throughout with captions. Decorated hard covers. Very slight corner wear. Good clean copy. Signed on the title page. With a card posted to Axel & Roslyn "... I've sent a UK & a US edition ... only wish I'd had the sense to work on the originals a bit: some (of the collage) show their seams too much ... (and referring to another book, see item 24) ... I don't suppose for a minute that they would exist if it hadn't been for your belief in me, years ago ... ! Meg". 28226. **£40** 'Comparable only with the work of Max Ernst and Rene Magritte, The Beautiful Island is an unparalleled adventure in the use of collage. A story? A poem? An idyll? An allegory? ... a joyful fantasy ... '.
- **24. Rutherford, Meg.** Bluff and Bran and the Scarecrow. Illustrated by the author. Andre Deutsch, London. 1984. (1st.ed). 28pp. (unnumbered). 25cm. Colour illustrations to accompany the text throughout. Laminated illustrated hard covers. Very good clean copy. Signed in full on the end paper with a message to 'Axel & Ros'. With: a pen and ink sketch of a 'strange' bird loosely inserted (see the lower image on the inside front cover of this catalogue) and a small card " ... Ros to amuse you to wish you a Very Happy Birthday ... Meg". **AND**: A very good clean copy of the Swedish edition of the same work (*Axel was of Swedish descent*) also signed in full and with a message. With a Birthday card for Axel, from Meg and Amis; a small watercolour of a cat peering out from beneath a curtain (a note on the back by Meg indicates this is a "a waif a reject"); and 4 black and white Polaroid photographs of the 'real' Bluff and Bran and their garden. A number of, mostly minor, typographical amendments, paragraph breaks, and corrections to names, and captions of images, presumably by the author (same pen) and indicative of poor proof-reading. (*One of the author's 'travel books' in this case her own country, visiting places off the beaten tourist track*).28299.**£30**
- **28. Gallagher, Katherine.** After Kandinsky. Vagabond Press. Rare Objects Series. Sydney, 2005. 12pp. 21cm. Soft covers with colour illustration (*by Kay Orchison*) laid down. Limited to 100 numbered copies signed







Maps. Aeronautical charts of the Northern parts of Australia produced during WWII. The whole of Australia and islands to the North, divided into a grid each with its own chart identified by a letter and number, e.g. D8 marked above; that chart included below. Scales vary but are approximately 15 miles to one inch (1:1,000,000). Publisher is not always stated but they were published by the Survey Branch of the Department of the Interior, Canberra. Some include the following request: "All service users of this map are requested to indicate necessary corrections hereon and return it to RAAF Headquarters through the usual channels". Each chart has much detail, including Landing Grounds, Radio Stations, Railways, Roads and Tracks, Transmission Lines, and physical features such as mountains and rivers. Some also have radio call signs, heights of masts, altitude in feet, emergency landing grounds, etc. Sheet size is c.55 x 75cm, and sheets are folded down to c.28 x 19cm. The charts have evidently seen use, there are some notes and marks, and some creasing. Generally, they are in good condition. See images on following page.


