


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

Opera Completa in 2 volumi.* 2 VOLUMES, 412pp, 392pp, two delicate small head-pieces finely engraved with maritime views, bound in contemporary boards, spines neatly repaired with original title labels preserved, presented in newly made cloth covered solander box, patterned endpapers, all edges red, Provenance: with stamp of Grosherzogliche Bibliothek Neustrelitz [The Grand Ducal Palace in Neustrelitz], very good condition, Chez Defer de Maisonneuve, Paris, 1790. * First published in London in 1787, a report to the members of the British Society for extending the fisheries and improving the sea coast of Scotland. Not traced in the B M catalogue. French text. £200

Fifth Edition, x + 287pp, bound in half calf with marbled boards, marbled endpapers and edges, raised bands and gilt lined, title label inset on brown morocco, Provenance: has the circular bookplate "AC of Upper Ossory" - [probably Dr Carroll] and the ownership signature of Augusta Fitzpatrick, very good condition, Meline, Cans et Compagnie, Bruxelles, 1843. * Picciola was first published in 1836 and was an immediate international success as a graceful, sentimental tale. Millar, London, 1748. * Armstrong had a masterful grasp of blank verse - the powerful passage from this didactic poem on the plague is highly praised. £85
