


8. HUNT, Leigh. *The Autobiography of Leigh Hunt.* 291pp, portrait. *Mrs Godolphin (1652-1678) was a courtier of distinction and friend of Evelyn the Diarist. This is probably the third edition. **£15**

9. BORROW, George. *The Romany Rye, With an Introduction by Walter Starkie.* xxxii + 414pp, blue cloth, gilt lettered, very good condition, The Cresset Press, London, 1948. * a splendid study of early 19th century England & its gypsies. **£15**

CRANE, Walter. *The Baby's Bouquet, A Fresh Bunch of Old Rhymes and Tunes.* 56pp, printed in colour throughout, numerous coloured illustrations, dark green pictorial glazed boards, square oblong 8vo, very good condition, engraved & printed in colour by Edmund Evans, London, circa 1900. * consists of words and musical notation with delightful illustrations. **£35**

CRANE, Walter. *The Baby's Opera, A Book of Old Rhymes With New Dresses* ... 56pp, printed in colour throughout, numerous coloured illustrations, red pictorial glazed boards, dust jacket, very good condition, square oblong 8vo, engraved & printed in colour by Edmund Evans, London. circa 1900. * charming little book with musical notation, words, songs and illustrations. **£35**

Suckling was best remembered for this 2 volume edition first published in 1646. **£65**

Lingua Toscana printed in Mantua in 1813. **£45**

F. Scholefield in 1901, James Parker and Co., Oxford, 1910. * delightful book for identifying architectural styles. **£45**

24. MASEFIELD, John & Constance (Selected & Edited By). *Lyrists of the Restoration from Sir Edward Sherburne to William Congreve.* xxiv + 282pp, vellum-type binding with throngs, 12mo, E. Grant Richards, London, 1905. * a pretty little volume in the 'The Chapbooks Series'. **£40**

27. BACKHOUSE, James. *Memoirs of Francis Howgill with Extracts from His Writings.* 200pp, new quarter calf, title label inset on red morocco, very good condition, W. Alexander & Sons, Castlegate, York, 1828. * Howgill (1618-1669), a Westmorland Quaker suffered imprisonment and was a voluminous and highly regarded writer. **£48**

[PIOZZI, Hester Lynch] HAYWARD, A. *Autobiography, Letters and Literary Remains of Mrs. Piozzi (Thrale), Edited with Notes and an Introductory Account of Her Life and Writings by A. Hayward.* 2 vols, over 900pp, two engraved frontispieces, contemporary buckram, a little foxed o/w very good condition, Longman, Green, Longman and Roberts, London, 1861. * a wealth of information on life, manners and personalities of the period. Best known for her friendship with Dr. Johnson. **£80**

ROBINSON, Edward. *Lawrence, the Story of His Life.* 250pp, coloured frontispiece, 32 pages of plates, brown cloth, cloth spotted but internally in very good condition, Oxford University Press, Oxford, 1935. * according to Lawrence's brother, the author was an eyewitness to many of the events. **£9**

CAMDEN, William. *Remains Concerning Britain.* xv + 446pp, engraved frontispiece, handcoloured armorial devices, new spine label, red cloth faded o/w very good condition, LARGE PAPER COPY, John Russell Smith, London, 1870. * the first 'modern' account of Britain, first printed in 1586 with a wealth of information on language, money, apparel, artillery, proverbs, poesies, epitaphs, etc. **£38**

36. SMITH, Rev. Sydney. *The Works of the Rev. Sydney Smith (3 VOLS).* 3 vols, over 1200pp, new quarter calf, title labels inset on morocco, a little foxed o/w very good condition, Carey & Hart, Philadelphia, 1844. * A SCARCE PHILADELPHIA EDITION: NCBEL only records the New York edition of the same year. Over 50 essays on Botany Bay, Man Traps, Spring Guns, Bentham, Poor Laws, Methodism, Female Education, Prisons, Chimney Sweeps, Ceylon, Captain Rock, Mission to Ashantee, New South Wales, etc. Smith was famous for his exuberant humour and wit. **£90**

As Carlyle said "Ten ordinary histories of kings ... were well exchanged against the tenth part of one good history of booksellers." **£70**
