ANON. ***Ewe School Copy Book.*** 89pp, bound in original boards with cloth spine, showing wear at head and foot of spine and softening of corners, ex-Library, no date of publication but possibly circa 1865, lacks title page and first leaf numbered 1/2 hence the vagueness over date and place of publication, probably a German imprint [Bremen?], probably in the Ewe language. This is a school primer with examples of scripts in the West African language and with English and German Alphabets, followed by world lists, Biblical quotations, prayers, stories etc. 6 black and white drawings within the text. Although this item is lacking and somewhat worn as described, the paper quality is sound and the binding secure. It is most unusual for primers such as this to exist. **£135**
