



Robert Parsons (1546 - 1610), a controversial Jesuit missionary, best known for his treatise on the doctrine of the Pope's deposing power to be an article of faith and his inciting the Spanish invasion of England. £1950

Cookson' crossed out and "Mrs Howard, Corby Castle, June 1858" added [it would appear that the volumes were trimmed and rebound at that stage as the first name has been curtailed], very good condition, James Ridgway and Sons, London, 1837. * a very handsome set. **£350**
